

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WHAT IS HIPEC?

Hyperthermic Intraperitoneal Chemotherapy (HIPEC) is a procedure done in the operating room, immediately following cytoreductive surgery. HIPEC is a 90-120 minute procedure where a continuously heated sterile solution containing a chemotherapeutic agent is pumped and circulated throughout the abdominal cavity. The heated chemotherapy solution can directly penetrate diseased tissue in an attempt to kill microscopic cancer cells. Heat has shown to effectively kill cancer cells and enhance chemotherapy.
